
Military Cross

OBITUARY



GEORGE MOORE JOHNSON, M.A., B.M., B.Ch. Oxon. Surgeon, Royal Navy.

Surgeon G. M. Johnson,

who met his death on H.M.S. "Defence" in the naval battle on May 31st, was 37 years of age, and the elder son of the late Mr. G. W. M. Johnson, of

Child's Bank, and of Mrs. Johnson, of Shortlands. Kent. He was educated at Charterhouse School and Magdalen College, Oxford, proceeding to the London Hospital in 1904, from which he took his B.M., B.Ch. in 1908. He then held the posts of House-Surgeon, and later House-Physician, at the Radcliffe Infirmary, Oxford. After gaining some experience in general practice, he went to Trinity. Newfoundland, in January, 1913, and practised there till after the outbreak of the War, returning to England in January, 1915. He then held the posts of Assistant Tuberculosis Officer and School Medical Officer for East Suffolk, till he applied for a post as surgeon in the Navy in September, 1915, when he was appointed to H.M.S. "Defence," and served in her till he met his death.

One of his colleagues writes of him:-"Always fond of sport and good at all games, he was a good shot and a keen and successful fisherman and boatman; indeed, in the course of his professional duties in Newfoundland, he often went out in such weather that the fishermen would be anxiously waiting his return. He had a very keen sense of his duty to his medical work, to which he applied abilities considerably above the average. His friends-and they were many-felt certain that he would have done good and distinguished service in his profession. Gifted with a superb body, he had a boundless store of energy, and lived his life with a zest and keenness it was a pleasure to watch, but beyond all was his unusual capacity of forming real friendships, socially and professionally, and his early death will make him sadly missed by a very wide circle."

Surgeon Johnson leaves a widow, to whom we offer our sympathy.

I first became acquainted with Johnson during the time when he was House-Surgeon at the Radcliffe Infirmary in 1908, so that I am unable to record anything of his life at the "London." Leaving Oxford in 1909, he went to Penzance, where he was in general practice for some 18 months. After that time—until he went to Newfoundland in the beginning of 1913—he worked in several general practices in different parts of the country, and was also for a short time acting as Assistant Medical Officer to an asylum where I once spent a somewhat merry week-end with him. At Trinity he was doing remarkably well, and might well have remained in Newfoundland if the War had not occurred, as he seemed to be more satisfied with his life and work under such surroundings than here at home in England. It was a matter of regret to his friends that he did not appear to be able to make up his mind to settle down and to take up some definite line of work, but I do not truly believe that circumstances, coupled with his rather impatient temperament,

allowed him to come to any decision. In his the school boasted. He entered the Hospital in work he shewed much ability, and was always capable of dealing with any difficult situation. By his patients he was respected for his professional skill, and there were few who did not appreciate the sympathy which he extended, often accompanied by some expression of his peculiarly characteristic humor. To his friends—and, indeed, to all—he was ever true and very straight in all his actions. There was nothing lukewarm or indifferent about Johnson; he did all that he had to do very thoroughly; and though we now mourn that he is no longer with us, we can find some comfort in the thought that the Death which he met was surely in keeping with his mode of life, in which there was nothing small.


Second-Lieutenant E. L. STEPHENSON

In the death in action of Second-Lieutenant E. L. Stephenson the Hospital has sustained a great loss. Owing to his quiet and unassuming ways, few recognised his sterling qualities, but to those who did he called for that admiration and respect of character that so few men are able to do.

Educated at Bishop's Stortford School, he was the most popular boy there, being not only a zealous worker, but a keen sportsman. I am told he represented his school in every branch of sport

May, 1911, and when War broke out had just succeeded in passing his "second." He was gazetted to a second-lieutenancy on June 18th, 1915, in the 3/4th Lincolnshire Regiment, in which he served until he was killed on March 18th, 1916. While at the Hospital he worked hard, and though his heart prevented him from taking part in athletics generally, he was a firstclass swimmer and turned out regularly for both the London and United Hospitals.
